All incidents involving an injury to a human, animal, and/or property must be reported to the area's Regional Manager immediately. All reports of incidents must be reported by the Regional Director to the Board of Directors immediately on receiving notification of an incident by completing the online incident report located on the CBRR&R website in Tools & Reports, Incident Reporting Form. An officer of the Board must review or assign a Board member or a Regional Director the online report immediately. The designee must review the report to determine the extent of any injuries and the need for additional Board follow-up. All injuries that require medical attention must be reported to the online system, to the Regional Director, and to the Board immediately. If the incident involved a dog bite, the Regional Director must evaluate using the Dunbar Scale and report their findings to the Board designee.
